The U.S. College Club (USCC) assists the “best and brightest” students to improve their chances at admission to a U.S. college or university. USCC uses a model of result-based, intensive group advising.

Objective: The objective of this free training program is to significantly increase chances of USCC members for admission at competitive U.S. colleges and universities. Committed participants who follow the full USCC program will be able to prepare a high quality application for admission and/or scholarship.

Although we cannot guarantee that the USCC member will be accepted to a U.S. college or university and/or receive scholarship support, the program maximizes the potential of the candidate and thus provide the member with the best possible chances.

Program Description: USCC involves a number of activities, including presentations, workshops, discussions, test preparation, readings assignments, volunteering and community service. The set of activities is planned for a period of one year and provides students with a solid background for a successful admission and study at a U.S. college or university.

Eligibility: Participation is open to highly motivated, academically talented secondary school students in their junior year (3. ročník/septima) at Czech national public or private secondary schools. USCC is open to all students regardless their nationality, ethnicity, or economic background.

There are five basic requirements for membership in the USCC between the March 2017 and February 2018:

1. Serious interest in studying in the United States of America.
2. Grade point average under 1,5 (in Czech grading system).
3. Commitment to participate at two compulsory meetings a month (with three possible absences only).
4. Commitment to participate in the volunteer/community service activities for a minimum of 8 hours/month on average.
5. Commitment to develop reading and writing competences in English by reading one book in English per two months and practice English writing.
